We are a heavily oversubscribed comprehensive school for girls with excellent GCSE results. 90% of students attained 5+ subjects overall including 9-4 English and Maths. **54% of all grades attained in all subjects at KS4 were 7-9**. We also have a large sixth form of 240 students where students achieve outstanding results with a percentage of top grades well above the national average.

The Grey Coat Hospital, when last inspected, was judged to be '**outstanding**' by OFSTED in October 2022. In 2020, the School achieved '**excellent**' in the Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools. We are proud of our ethos of continued self-improvement, which characterises every aspect of our culturally diverse school. The school is committed to building on our passion for excellent teaching and learning as well as continuing to place an emphasis on our language specialism and international ethos.
