## **Further Information:**

**Pupils in Year 7 are expected to spend 20 minutes on each piece of homework.**

**Art:** Students will receive homework relating to schemes of learning. However there will be some project-based tasks that will be completed at home over a number of weeks. Pupils will be given a deadline to meet with regards to handing in their project and it is expected that the quality of their work will reflect the time given in lessons and time they should spend at home completing it.

**Drama within English:** Pupils will have Drama for one English lesson per fortnight and homework will be due in the next lesson. This means that students will often have a full timetable rotation to do the work. The majority of Drama work is practical and group-based. This will mean that there will only be occasional homework that will involve learning lines, completing scripts or finding costumes, for example.

**ICT:** The majority of ICT work is project-based computer work. Homework may be set during the design and evaluation stages of these projects. All projects are assessed and contribute towards the pupils' National Curriculum levels for ICT. Pupils may choose to work on their projects at home on a computer; it is, however, not 'set' homework. Pupils will have access to the computer rooms on a number of specified days after school to work on their ICT projects.

**Modern Foreign Languages:** Homework tasks for MFL will be varied and will focus mainly on reading, writing and the learning of vocabulary and grammar rules, although listening, speaking and research based tasks may also be set throughout the year. As a general guideline, each task should take roughly 20 minutes however, before key assessments, students will be required to prepare thoroughly for listening, speaking, reading or written tests which will take longer and preparation for these will occasionally be set over a couple of weeks.

**PE:** Pupils are encouraged to attend one extra-curricular sport club and to take part in moderate intensity exercise for 1 hour per day.

**RE:** Homework in RE will be varied, but often include reflection, research or extended writing. Reflective tasks should reflect careful thought and personal insights; research tasks should utilise more than one source (books, interviews, internet etc.); each written task must improve on the last one and be properly developed and checked.
