

## The Grey Coat Hospital Executive – Governing Body

### ROD CLARK

Rod Clark is currently Chair of Governors. He was first elected as a parent governor in 2012 and for a time chaired the Finance Committee. He was appointed Deputy Chair before stepping up to Chair following the tragic early death of Vicki Simmons. Rod is committed to the Christian ethos of Grey Coat and passionate about the power of education to transform lives especially for the disadvantaged. For eight years he led a charity in prison education and brings extensive experience of governance from his career in the Civil Service and in senior leadership. He also serves on the Personnel, Nominations, Finance, Development and Strategy Committees.

Dr Glenda Cooper was appointed as a parent governor in 2021 and also serves on the Development Committee. She is a former BBC and Washington Post correspondent, (from August 2024 she will transit to be Head of the journalism department at City, University of London). 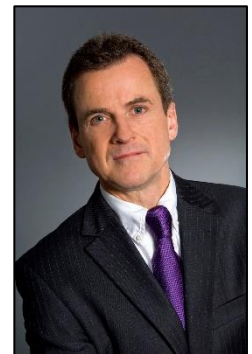
## JACKY SCHROER

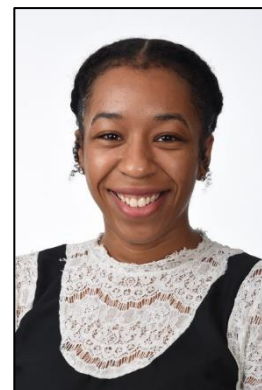
## SUSANNE STAAB
